From The Principal Kia ora koutou



Here we are at the end of the term – it's frightening how quickly the year seems to be disappearing. With just 14 Fridays to go before Christmas we are into the process of making end of year lists and crossing things off as they are achieved.

Yesterday morning I visited the Tāwhirimātea team who have been camping at Blue Skies in Kaiapoi this week. It was a chilly morning but it didn't seem to bother the children as they worked through a rotation of activities including orienteering, building bivvies and a pretty daunting looking climbing wall.

Hours of planning go into school camps. It's not simply a matter of where and when to go. Teachers have to plan for every possible situation that might occur. Sadly, not all schools are allowing camps anymore - for many, the health and safety concerns, the necessary parental involvement and the cost, have made it prohibitive. I'm so grateful that we have teachers who are prepared to take on the extra workload to provide opportunities for our children to challenge themselves in a safe environment, and that we have parents who give so freely of their time to ensure that our teachers and your children have the support they require.

New Appointments

We have already started work on planning for 2017. We have two new senior staff members joining us next year - Helen Hogarth and Nogo Sipeli. Helen is currently the Associate Principal at Springston School and will be known to some of you from her days as a team leader at Freeville School. Nogo (pronounced Nongo) is also an experienced deputy principal. We are fortunate to be able to attract leaders of their calibre to our school. Both will be in teaching roles next year.

We also congratulate Sharon Thompson, Lauren Yaxley, Amy Parish and Julia Smith on being appointed to our permanent teaching staff, along with Brogan Darby who will be joining us from Ashgrove School.

In order for us to fill any remaining positions and plan the structure of our learning studios for next year we need to have accurate information about enrolments. If you have a child who will be starting school as a new entrant in 2017 please make sure you have completed an enrolment form. If you know now that your child will not be returning to Rāwhiti next year it is also essential that you let us know as soon as possible. With our enrolment zone likely to be in place for the beginning of the new school year this information will help us determine how many out of zone places we have to offer at each level of the school


The playing season starts on the 15th of October with team entries from clubs due from clubs by the 28th of September so the clock is ticking - get involved.
