Rāwhiti School 'Goal Setting' Meetings Monday 30th January 2017

We will be starting the 2017 school year with 'Goal Setting' meetings on Monday 30th January. While this is our first day of school for the year, children are only required to attend for their 'Welcome Home' meeting with their parent/s and teacher.

The Goal Setting meetings are set to start at the following times in each Learning Studio:

- 9 am
- 10 am
- 11 am
- 12 pm

Meetings will run for 45 minutes. You may choose which session you attend and do not need to book in.

Between 1.30pm and 3.30pm teachers will be available in their rooms for those who are unable to get to a morning meeting, or for those of you with larger families who might find it difficult to attend all the meetings in the morning.

We do understand that some of you may find it difficult to attend without having a specific appointment time and you are welcome to arrange this directly with your child's Key Teacher using their school email address as contact. You will find this email address on the letter of introduction from the teachers, and on our school web site.

Meeting Format

Teachers will start the meeting by showing you around the Learning Studios then sharing information about the programme, routines and expectations.

This will be followed by time for children and parents/caregivers to set some transition goals. Teachers will assist with the writing of the goals, which will be recorded and become part of your child's learning profile. These are not parent interviews.

Children do not need to wear uniform for the Goal Setting Meetings.
