Last week several schools in Christchurch needed to be evacuated, along with others from around NZ, after a hoax bomb threat. You may have read about this in the media.

How would you like to be notified if such an event happened to us? After following the procedures advised by the Police, parents would be sent a text message (if we have your cell phone contact details), an email message would be sent via our student management system, and we would post an alert on the Rāwhiti School App.

331 people have downloaded our App. If you haven't yet got around to this, simply Go to the App Store on your Apple or Android device and search Rāwhiti School to download the App to your phone or tablet. Our App is free for users.
