Learning Conversations April 11-14

In the last week of term we are offering all parents and caregivers the opportunity to make a time for a 'Learning Conversation' with your child and their key teacher/s. Learning Conversations are just that – an opportunity for you, your child and a teacher to meet together to discuss the learning that has happened this term. The format may be slightly different in each Learning Studio. Children will be able to share with you how they have managed the challenges of moving to our new site, and teachers will share with you the information they have gathered this term about your childs learning and achievement. We set aside 30 minutes for each Learning Conversation as we know you will have plenty to talk about!

Scooters at School

We have been working through a number of issues relating to children bringing their scooters to school. We are trying to problem solve each issue as it arises, as we would hate to have to ban the use of scooters at school – they are such a great way for our children to burn off energy during the breaks. We have made a change to where our littlest children are storing their scooters to reduce congestion at the end of breaks, and this seems to be working. They are now parking much closer to their learning studios. We have also put a stop to children using the avenue of trees as a scooter race track as it is our main pedestrian access to the school.

Does your child have a lock for their scooter/bike? We have had a number of scooters either going missing or children going home with the wrong scooter by mistake. We are still missing a purple MGP scooter with the name Maia Macbeth on the side. Maia is a pre-schooler and her scooter was only in the grounds for a few minutes at the end of the day. Please check that your child has the right scooter! We strongly recommend that bikes and scooters are locked when brought to school using a cycle lock with a combination (rather than a key which can also get lost). This helps to keep these high cost items secure and will prevent them from going missing.

Easter Break

Smoking Outside the School Gate

Please be considerate of our children when smoking outside the school gate. While there is no smoking on school grounds by law, the footpath is a public space and parents and caregivers are entitled to smoke there. However it is not ideal for our children to have to make their way through groups of smokers to exit the grounds and we receive regular phone calls from parents expressing their concerns.

Rookwood Ave Roundabout & Bowhill Road Crossing

We had just one response to our request for assistance in helping children safely cross some of the busy roads surrounding the school. We have a trained Kea Crossing patrol at the front of the school morning and afternoon, but need help to monitor what is happening at both the Bowhill Road crossing and the Rookwood Ave roundabout. 2016 School Accounts

You will have received your child's current school account. Funds from School donations are an important part of the school budget and allow us to provide superior resources for our students. Payment of the donation is voluntary. Activity donations go towards the costs of equipment, experiences, and services which are extra to the school's curriculum obligations. They also go towards curriculum based activities which involve a 'take home' component for the student to keep. Rāwhiti School's activity donation is paid per activity. Parents are invoiced for costs relating to sport and class activities, cultural performances, and Technicraft fees for years 7 and 8. The cost of transport to Phillipstown for Technicraft is funded by the Ministry of Education.

We encourage you to make regular weekly payments to help with budgeting school expenses. Our bank account number is: 03 0814 0000333 25. Please put your child's name as a reference. Eft-pos is available in the school office and if cash is been sent to school, please put in a sealed envelope with your child's name, room number and reason for payment. In all instances if payment for an event/trip is going to be difficult for you we encourage you to contact the school office as soon as possible to discuss options with you.
