
Uniform Options

This code of conduct is between Rāwhiti School, students who travel on the school bus and their parents/caregivers. It is important that students understand this document, which is to be adhered to for the safety of all students travelling on our school buses.

AGREEMENT	
I, (student) understand and accept the following	
school bus rules:	
<u>I WILL:</u>	
 Make sure I am at the school bus meeting point, or the public bus stop on time. 	
 Wait sensibly at the bus meeting point. (Keyes Road passengers should wait near the 	<u>)</u>
public bus stop, standing quietly on the footpath. No scootering or skating around the	ne
bus stop)	
Sit quietly in my seat.	
 Stay in my seat while the bus is moving. 	
 Put my bag on the floor or on my knees. 	
 Make sure my scooter or skateboard is out of the aisle and secure. 	
 Walk quietly from the bus when I get off. 	
 Follow any instructions from the Bus Driver or the adult/monitor responsible for bus 	
duty.	
 Tell the bus monitor/adult in charge if I have a concern. 	
I WILL NOT:	
Eat or drink on the bus.	
 Throw anything out of the windows. 	
 Distract the driver while the bus is moving. 	
 Be disruptive or annoying to other passengers. 	
Damage or vandalise the bus.	
If I misbehave on the bus, the bus monitor/bus driver may report it, and I may be shifted to a different seat on the bus, or excluded from travelling on the bus for a set time, or indefinitely.	ed

Year 4-8 Cross Country

Hi all, Rāwhiti School's first Cross Country is coming up soon. This year we're all meeting at the beach, racing, and then having lunch and a play over the road at Thomson Park.

- Date is Tuesday May 12.
- Postponement is Wednesday 13.
- The race start will be on the beach near the North Brighton Surf Lifesaving Club, on Marine Parade by Bowhill Rd.
- We're aiming to start racing at 11:00.
- The first race is for Year 4,5 and 6, followed a separate race for Year 7/8.
- As runners finish they will directed into a chute so that their details can be recorded and places worked out.
- Competitors race against children from their year group not their age group.
- Year 4 compete in the school event, but not in the zone event the following week.
- Year 4,5 and 6 run a 2km course.
- Year 7/8 run a 3km course.

The aim is for competitors to set a personal best, therefore everybodys goal will be different, e.g. for some their goal will be to finish in the top 10, and for many their goal will be to run the whole way. We want this event to be super positive with tons of encouragement and cheering on, so please come down to support our runners!

- You cannot get influenza from the vaccine
- Influenza immunisation is FREE for those most at risk
