Learning Conversation Bookings

Home Learning

At Rāwhiti School we believe learning happens everywhere and that often the best learning is a result of shared experiences and conversations. We understand that families have busy lives and children are often involved in many out of school activities and sports. Research shows traditional homework does not work, and that if home learning becomes stressful it actually turns children off learning, becomes ineffective and can have a negative impact for families. Research acknowledges that while reading and learning basic facts is beneficial for learners, all other compulsory homework (in primary schools) is not proven to improve outcomes.

We do not want to send home 'busy' work which does not relate to the classroom. Consequently at Rāwhiti, set home learning tasks are minimal. No time-wasting, rote, repetitive tasks that lack clear instructional or learning purposes will be assigned. Ideally, we want children to understand that they are learners everywhere – at school and at home.

Home learning should be based on a child's progress and individual needs. The best thing to do to support children of all ages is to assist them with reading and basic facts, and basic sight words (high frequency words) for juniors. There are several ways that parents can best support children's learning at home - and teachers can discuss this with you at Learning Conversations. We are currently working on a page for our web site that will give you access to many home learning challenges.

Mufti Day on Friday

Two of our senior students, Abby and Kimiya, have organised a mufti day for this Friday (March 27th) with all funds raised being used to purchase supplies for schools in Vanuatu devastated by Cyclone Pam. Please support their fundraising by sending a gold coin donation on Friday. Children can wear mufti, and the girls will be running a dress up competition as part of the day. Both girls see this as being one way of repaying the kindness shown to our own community from all around the globe in 2011, and we thank them for taking action on our behalf.
