Jasmine joins our permanent teaching staff as Kaiwhakahaere Kaupapa Reorua – the team leader for our bilingual programme. As this team has not had an opportunity yet to start the planning for next year no decisions have been made as to who will take responsibility for teaching at each age level, or how the groupings within Ata Hāpara will be determined.

Outstanding Activity Fees

A reminder that Activity Fees are supposed to be paid prior to your child going on a trip, unless you have made prior arrangement with the school. We currently have just under \$10,000.00 of outstanding activity fees for things like technology, camps, swimming lessons, museum trips and winter sports that the school now has to find the funds to cover. As we have said throughout the year, we are only to happy to work with you to help you manage these costs. Our office staff are very approachable and only too pleased to assist you. If you are in a position to clear these overdue payments before the end of the year we would be very grateful.

Absence Notification

We ask that when your child is away from school, for any reason, that you please ring the school and leave a message stating your child's name, room number and reason why they will be absent. If your child is away and we do not know why, then we will make contact with you via a phone call. We do this for safety reasons.

Most of our phone calls to our Parents/Caregivers are to a cellphone and so it costs us to make these calls. This year we have spent an average of \$200 per month making these calls, that is an annual amount of \$2,400 which is 110 hours of Teacher Aide support OR 220 new library books OR 5 Mini iPads.

Last Days of School

School officially closes for the year at mid-day on Thursday Dec 17th. However we have been advised that in order to meet the completion deadline for the new buildings, contractors will need to start removing essential services being transferred to the new school from our current sites – server, Wifi, network switches, phones and copiers – from Wednesday Dec 16th. This will make it difficult for us to operate as normal.

Therefore we will be offering an alternative programme on our **BEACH BASE SITE** on Wednesday 16th from 9.00am – 3.00pm and on Thursday 17th from 9.00am – 12.00pm. After School Care 2016

The RSCI programme will continue to run from the Beach Base, utilising the existing prefabs and playgrounds. RSCI will collect children from our Leaver Terrace site each day and transport them to the Beach Base. Parents will collect their children from the Beach Base at the end of their working day.

The SKIDS team will operate from the Aranui base where they currently run their before school programme. SKIDS will also provide a dedicated pick up service for children requiring after school care and transport them to Aranui School, where parents can collect them at the end of their working day.

Music Lessons at Rāwhiti in 2016
