From the Principal Kia ora koutou

Our last whole school assembly for the term takes place next Thursday at 11am in the Roy Stokes Hall on the Beach Base. We are very much looking forward to the first performance by our kapahaka group - please do join us if you are able to. The Ministry of Education continues to fund the buses we use to transport our children between bases for assemblies, and we are grateful for this continued financial support.

Congratulations to Q8 and Q10 who took out 1st and 2nd places at the Canterbury DigiAwards with their 'Everyday Hero' movies.

Whooping Cough

The number of confirmed Whooping Cough cases continues to grow and I ask that you remain vigilant, especially if you have little ones in the home, people who are already sick or elderly. All information relating to Whooping Cough that we circulate is given to us by the Medical Officer of Health for Canterbury, who is monitoring carefully the number of cases in our community. We are obliged by law to follow all directions that he issues. We are hearing that there are cases of misdiagnosis occurring with initial blood tests proving negative, but positive results coming from subsequent nasal swabs. If you are in any doubt about your childs health please see your GP.

It is essential that you notify the school office immediatley if your child has not been immunised. This information is always collected when children enrol at school – but this information has not been transferred to us in the merger process.

Swimming Pool

The Ministry of Education has given its approval for us to begin work on upgrading the swimming pool on our home site in Leaver Terrace. The BOT has committed funds inherited from an insurance payout on the old Freeville School hall, and the PTA has made a huge donation of \$20,000 – which means that we are able to start work on phase one of the redevelopment. This includes work heating the pool, and installing a PVC liner to protect and prevent leaks. We are hopeful that this will all be completed in time for our return home.

2016 Term Dates

There is a requirement that school is open for 384 half days in 2016. The BOT has set the opening and closing dates as follows:

- Term 2 Monday May 2nd Friday July 8th
- Term 3 Monday July 25th Friday September 23rd
- Term 4 Monday October 10th Friday December 16th

Details about the organisation for the first week of school, inlcuding our 'homecoming' celebrations, are being worked on at present and will be available next term. If you have time to take a drive past the building site you will see that they are making great progress with the landscaping, and our feature 'sunrise' over the new school hall is now in place.


