From The Principal

Kia ora koutou

Yesterday we held a Wig Mufti Day to raise money for the Child Cancer Foundation. Unfortunately, cancer affects the lives of so many of our Rāwhiti families in some way. Yesterday I listened to one of our 7 year olds share her personal experience of cancer treatment with all of the other children in her studio, and a number of parents too. I think all of us were moved by her presentation. It was great to see so many of our children get behind this great fund raising cause and we are thrilled to have raised \$503.90 for the Child Cancer Foundation.

Reverse Evacuation

Yesterday we had our first trial run of our Reverse Evacuation procedures for school. You may have previously heard this referred to as a 'Lock Down'. In certain situations it may be necessary to move, or keep, all students inside. These situations include severe storms, a major accident in the school vicinity, or other dangerous situations. The school has a detailed plan for these events, and will practise with students and staff twice a year. Unlike our other emergency procedures, the details for a Reverse Evacuation are not published on our School Docs site or made available to the wider school community. In the event of us needing to enact a Lock Down for any real reason then parents and caregivers would be notified via our School App and emergency text system. Please keep us up to date with any changes to your contact details so that we can keep you informed. If you have not yet downloaded our free school App then now is a good time to so.

Lost, Missing or Stolen?

Almost daily we receive a message that a child at school has had something 'stolen' – their sweatshirt, shoes, lunch box, scooter or fidget spinner. The thought that someone has taken something that belongs to you is very upsetting for most people and we sometimes deal with very distressed children, and angry parents.

However, in many instances the missing items are quickly located in the lost property box or somewhere around the school grounds. I spent time last week helping a distressed girl look for her 'stolen' shoes, which we found under the sofa in her learning studio where she had put them after the lunch break. When you lose your sweatshirt or scooter – it's not stolen. It could still be in the place you last used it.

Unfortunately, we do have a few children who do not understand that 'finders keepers' is not the law. Theft by finding occurs when someone who chances upon something that does not appear to have an owner, takes possession of it but fails to take steps to find out whether the item does actually belong to someone. A good example of this is when a scooter is left at school overnight and someone removes it from the school grounds and takes it home for their own use. Or an item of school uniform is found and the name tag of the owner is removed.

Fortunately for us, most of our community are really good at returning things that a child brings home that does not belong to them. Please encourage your children to return anything that you may find at home that does not belong to them. It's an important lesson to learn, and another good example of acting with Integrity – doing the right thing even though no one is watching.

Invariably, things will go missing or be lost at school – but there is never a reason for things to be stolen.
