In January, Charlotte (Tane Mahuta) was chosen and attended the women's Gymnastics elite training camp for Gymnastics New Zealand. The selection was based on her performance last year at Nationals where she placed 7th overall in New Zealand at step 6 and qualified for the second day competition. Only 35 gymnasts from the whole of New Zealand at Steps 6/7/8 combined were selected.

The future goal for this squad is to represent New Zealand internationally, including the Commonwealth Games in 2022 and at the Olympics in 2024.
