Learning Conversations

Bookings for Learning Conversations are now open for all students in **Year 4-8**. Year 1-3 students have received a separate email with a different code if you need to make a booking. Children in Years 1-3 will have their learning conversations on the anniversary of their time being at school for 20, 40, 60, 80, 100 or 120 weeks at school. If you haven't received an invitation for a learning conversation this term don't worry you will receive one next term. Children and teachers will be able to talk with you about their learning and their next learning steps. If you have other concerns or need more time with an individual teacher we ask you to make another appointment directly with the teacher.


