From The Principal Kia ora koutou



Welcome back everyone. It has certainly been a warm start to the 'winter' term and, as always, there is no easing in to the new term. On Monday we welcomed 17 new children to Rāwhiti School, and on Wednesday afternoon we hosted 280 teachers from across the city for a Literacy Association workshop. The Year 8's are away on their leadership camp at Peel Forrest – so the place is a little quieter than usual.

Staff Changes

This week we welcome Jordan Shallcrass to our teaching staff. Jordan is going to be replacing Nicole Johnston who will be taking maternity leave from the beginning of Week 3. Jordan has already started working in Tāwhirimātea alongside the rest of the teaching team to ensure a smooth transition for everyone.

Some of you may be aware that Wayne McQueen's wife, Annette, is involved in a long term battle with cancer. Unfortunately her health has deteriorated over the holiday period; therefore Wayne will be taking some leave for a few weeks to support Annette through this next stage of her illness. I know you will all join with me in sending messages of support to Wayne, Annette and their three sons. We are really grateful to Jude Seeto who has agreed to step in and join the Tāne Mahuta team for the next few weeks. Jude will be known to some of you from her work at North New Brighton School.

Later this term Teresa Price will be leaving us to take up a new position at Thorrington Primary School. The appointments process for a replacement teacher is underway and we will farewell Teresa later in the term.

Switching On

You probably haven't noticed that we are utilising solar power because our solar panels are on the roof on the north side of our building. The solar photovoltaic (PV) panels have been arrayed onto the school roof in a partnership between the school and Genesis Energy. The panels will generate up to 20 kilowatts of power, which over the course of the year is expected to contribute about 25,000 kilowatt-hours of electrical energy to the school. Much of this solar generated electricity will be consumed immediately within the school and will help ease our energy bills. You can visit www.schoolgen.co.nz at any time to see how much solar energy we are generating. So far in May we have generated 229kWh, and our total for April was 2163kWh.



The Schoolgen Programme helps students and teachers to understand more about electricity and ways in which it can be generated, as well as learning about global sustainability. Our learning focus for this term is 'Switching On' and is based in the Science and Technology Curriculum – watch throughout the term for opportunities for parents and whanau to get involved in this learning. If you are using our grounds this weekend please be aware that there will be some building work taking place outside the junior learning studios where we are increasing the height of the sand pit surround to help keep the sand contained and to provide a seat for children.

Board of Trustee Elections

Board of Trustee elections are being held this month. Nominations close on the 20th May at 12.00pm. If the number of nominations does not exceed vacancies there will be no need to hold an election. Should nominations be more than the required number then a vote will be held. If this is the case voting papers will be posted to families. Voting closes on the 3rd June 2016 at 12.00pm. Results will be published following this date.

Our current Board of Trustees has written the following statement.

"Your current Board of Trustees is a very diverse team of people (two staff members and five parents). They are teachers (primary, secondary, tertiary); banker; lecturer; local business owner; HR specialist; IT specialist and principal who share one important passion - the children of Rāwhiti Primary School and their learning potential.
