



From the Principal
Kia ora koutou

Welcome back to you all, and a particularly warm welcome to the many new families who have joined the Rāwhiti School community this term. Our school continues to grow and we have started the new term with 520 on the roll.

Our teachers did not have their feet up all holidays! Twenty two of the staff joined me for three days in Auckland last week to attend the Core Education 'Ulearn' conference. The focus was on transforming teaching and learning, so was very relevant for our staff as we prepare for the next stage in the life of our new school.

2016 Uniform

I am sure that you will be delighted to hear that the Board of Trustees are once again going to provide support for the purchasing of the new school uniforms for next year. For children in Years 1-6 the BOT will fund one polo-shirt and one polar fleece, and for students in Year 7 & 8 the BOT will fund one polo-shirt and one senior jacket. This offer applies to all children who have attended Rāwhiti School in 2015. We have been assured the uniform samples will be here in the next week so that you can establish what sizes you will need, and can order for your child.

Based on the feedback from the uniform survey, children will continue to wear plain black lower half items such as trousers, shorts and skirts. These items should be plain black and have no additional colours, lace or logos. Jeans will not be permitted.

A reminder that Sunhats must be worn in Term 4 – thanks to those who managed to hunt these out over the holiday break. There is no regulation sunhat for 2015 so children can wear whatever sunhat they have, provided it has a full brim. No caps, and no offensive slogans please.

Planning for 2016

We are currently advertising teaching positions for the 2016 school year. Anne Westwood will be retiring at the end of the school year. While Anne will be new to some of you at Rāwhiti, she has been part of the Freeville School community for many years. Tania Luke has also resigned from her position in order to spend more time with her young son – a decision we all understand. We will farewell them both later in the term.

In order to plan effectively for 2016 and ensure we appoint enough staff to start the year, we need to have a clear indication as to the number of children we are planning for. If you know that your plans for 2016 do not involve Rāwhiti School please take the time to let us know now. Parents of Year 6 students have a letter to return regarding their intentions for Year 7 enrolment. We would appreciate these being returned by the end of the week to the Beach Base office. As all of our teachers will be working in collaborative teams next year, there is no longer a need for intensive class placement procedures. Each child will still have a key teacher, as they have this year, so if you feel you need to share any information with us regarding your child's needs and the type of teacher you would like to see them placed with, please let us know by emailing admin@rawhiti.school.nz.

If you are interested in finding out more about how your child can benefit from the bilingual programmes operating in Ata Hāpara please do attend the upcoming information session on Wednesday October 28th (see flyer accompanying this newsletter). For 2016 we will be accepting enrolments into our bilingual unit from within the school. If you think this is an option for your child please come along on the 28th and discuss it with us.

Today many of our classes took part in the national Shake Out drill. While the routine is fairly entrenched for most of us, some of our youngest pupils have not had as much practice as the rest of us, especially in a school setting. You might like to talk to your child about how they managed the drill this morning and practice the 'Drop, Cover, Hold' routine at home as well.
