

## From the Principal

Kia ora koutou

Thanks to everyone who got in behind our Kindness Week initiative last week and supported their children in carrying out random acts of kindness around the school. There was a very positive vibe around the school last week, and such a lot of smiling. The children decorated beautiful Kindness Rocks which have been spread far and wide around the city, and we are really excited to be getting messages from people who have found a Rāwhiti rock.

Of course the most exciting thing that happened was when Flat Man put in an appearance at our Friday assembly, and we were proud to be able to hand over \$443.10 from our mufti day to support the charitable work that he does.

We are really grateful to Erica and Johanna (from Mindful Movers) and our amazing PTA for organising our first ever Kindness Week. The thing for our children to remember is that kindness is contagious, and it is also free, which means that every week can be Kindness Week at Rāwhiti.

### Term 4 Swimming

The swimming pool complex is having a makeover ahead of the swimming season. The pool is set to open on Monday November 20<sup>th</sup>. To kick off the season all Rāwhiti students will have 10 swimming lessons with a professional coach here at school in our own pool. This means there are no unnecessary bus costs transporting children to a public pool, and we don't waste hours of travelling time each day. Children will be ability grouped for these sessions.

Thanks to the QE2 Swim club we have received a grant from the Rata Foundation to support the cost of these lessons. This combined with the recent donation from SURF means that half hour lessons will only cost \$2.50 each. This amount will be added to your last school invoice for the year. Payment can either be made on-line or at the office any time before December 1<sup>st</sup>.

### VisTab Visitor Management System

We are seeking a local business to sponsor the Vistab System for our school. Vistab is an automated health and safety sign in and out system for our pupils, staff, relieving teachers, volunteers, contractors and casual visitors to the school. Vistab replaces the paper visitor books and health and safety paperwork at reception with a touch screen procedure that's easy to use.



In the event of an emergency or an evacuation, Vistab can report from the evacuation assembly point who has come and gone from the school since the roll was last taken. **Can you help?** Your business and branding will be displayed on the front screen of the tablet for all to see. We will recognise the support of your business on our website, in our newsletter and on social media once finalised. We have hundreds of visitors per year that will see your business details and the support you have given to our school.



### **Sun Hats Policy**

We are enforcing our school policy around sun safety, where all children must wear their hats during interval, lunchtimes and when outside playing sports in Term 4. All our children know about this expectation, but that doesn't mean that they like it! Children who are not wearing a hat are required to spend their break time in the shade under the veranda along the front of the building. We do have sunscreen available here at school.

Tomorrow is Athletics Day for Years 5-8, and it is children in these age groups who seem to be most hat-averse. Please help us to promote safe behaviours in the sun.

### **New Play Area**

There is much excitement here ahead of the Tuesday opening of the first of our new play areas. We have one task left to complete and that is to spread mulch around all of the new planting in the area on Saturday morning. Our experts tell us that this should take 6 people about an hour to complete. If you have an hour to donate to the school on Saturday morning please be here at 10am to lend a hand. BYO shovel and wheelbarrow if you have them. If not, don't let that deter you – we have plenty of school equipment we can share around.

## Wattie's Cans for Good



We are lucky enough to be able to offer some more FREE Mindfulness sessions to our parents/caregivers from the wonderful Johanna & Erica from Mindful Movers.

Here are the dates and sessions:

### Parent & Child Evening Session - Monday 13 November, 6.30pm in the school hall.

This is a chance for all our working mums and dads to come along and experience a gentle and fun mindfulness session with their child. The session will run for one hour and is a really great way to take a break and connect with your kid. The feedback from earlier sessions have been fantastic. Maximum of approx 10 pairs.

## Restorative Mindfulness (adult only) - Tuesday 14 November 9.00am in the school hall.

Restorative is a gentle way of stretching that focuses on recharging and relaxing in which poses are held for a bit longer in order to really just enjoy being present and relaxed. Often the poses require less physical exertion and sometimes blocks or straps are used to assist in your ability to really let go and relax in the posture. Again this is a one hour session and the session can hold up to 25 people.

For both of these sessions you will need to register by filling in the form at the office and please leave your contact details so we can contact you if we fail to get enough numbers. I would encourage, however, everyone to have a go even if you're a bit nervous. It's nothing too daunting and we're so lucky that we can offer these free to you to enjoy. 
