From The Principal



Kia ora koutou

Our Learning theme for the year has been 'Power' and last week Mother Nature sent us a message reminding us just how powerful she is. I would like to acknowledge the stamina of our Rāwhiti staff, many of whom faced their own challenges overnight, but were at work on Monday to complete the necessary safety checks and then here early on Tuesday morning to ensure that children were welcomed back to their normal routine. I am really proud of the professionalism and dedication of our staff.

Thanks also to the children who have organized the mufti day tomorrow, arranged for care packages to be sent to Kaikoura, and sent kind and supportive messages to the children whose schools have been impacted by this quake. One child told me this week that he feels like he is paying back some of the kind things that were done for him when we had 'our quake'. Empathy is an important quality, and our children know exactly what others are now going through.

Things only get busier from here on in and we know that the next 3 weeks will fly by. We will be publishing a newsletter each Thursday until the end of the term, to keep you up to date with what is happening. Please note some of the key dates in our What's Coming Up section and add them to your (already busy) diary.

Tsunami Evacuation Procedures

If we receive warning that a tsunami is predicted and evacuation is advised:

- Parents will be informed that we have received an evacuation notification from Civil Defence. This information will be sent by text and notifications will also be posted on our school website, on Facebook, and via the Rāwhiti School App.
- Teachers will be notified and classes will assemble on the netball courts. Teachers will have full class lists that include parent/caregiver details, and emergency contacts.
- Once rolls have been checked classes will begin the walk to Waitakiri School, 170 Burwood Road, Christchurch 8083. **This is the destination advised by Civil Defence.** The School Hall is the gathering point at Waitakiri.
- The route for walking is Leaver Terrace, Marriots Road, Rookwood Ave, Travis Road, Burwood Road.
- Staff and students will stay together.
- Teachers will maintain class lists of students collected by parents or nominated emergency contacts, including who students have gone home with and the time. Students may only be uplifted by a parent/caregiver, or one of the emergency contacts identified on the enrolment form.
- Special needs students who have been identified with mobility difficulties will be transported to Waitakiri School in the Rāwhiti School vans, driven by the Learning Support Coordinator or the Caretaker.
- The Principal or a Deputy Principal will follow up at the rear in a vehicle, with the daily roll, and first aid (including Epi Pens for students with life threatening allergies) and communication resources.

If we receive notification during the school day of an event of distant origin e.g. earthquake in South America, with a warning time of 10 or more hours:

- Parents will be notified by email, web site, Facebook, and Rāwhiti School App so that they can make their own decision as to whether they uplift their child from school.
- We will remain open for the school day.
- We will track events as they develop throughout the evening in order to make an informed decision about school closure.

This information is on our school web site under the General Information tab - Emergencies.

Now is a great time to ensure the school office has your updated phone contact details, and that we also have two nominated emergency contacts listed for your child.



School Zone

On Monday of this week we received official notification from the Ministry of Education that our enrolment zone boundaries have been confirmed. The board has now formally adopted the enrolment scheme, which will be operational from January 1st 2017. This means that we now have to run a ballot for out of zone enrolments wanting to start in Term 1 of next year. The ballot will be held on Friday December 9th, and applications must be at the school office no later than midday on Wednesday December 7th. If you have already completed an Out of Zone application form then you are automatically in the ballot. If you live outside the zone and have not yet completed a form please contact Jan in the office as soon as possible.

In 2017 a ballot will be held each term for enrolments the following term. Up to date enrolment scheme information will be added to the school web site under the General Information tab.

Class Structure

We are putting the finishing touches to the student groupings for next year. In 2017 all of our Learning Studios will have composite year levels. By "composite classes," we mean putting two or more consecutive year-groups together in one class – which is how the school is currently organised. Composite classes are not new. They are a common form of class organisation in schools across the country. However composite classes can be a source of worry for some, especially where parents believe that their child is being disadvantaged in some way if they are placed in a composite class.

Each year we put a lot of thought into how best to provide an equitable and practical school structure. In next weeks newsletter we will outline the structure of each of the studios and the teachers who will be working in each space.

Remember, if you want to know more about National Standards and end of year reports, Helen and I will be running short session in the school library at 9am tomorrow. All welcome.
