From the Principal

Playing Our Part

This term our learning has been based in the Social Studies Curriculum, with children unpacking how they can be a good citizen and exploring the part they can play in making life better for others.

Yesterday we saw the stunning culmination of this learning, with the Year 2 and 3 children from Haumia-tiketike organising a craft market afternoon to raise money to support the '12 Chairs' project for the Children's Ward at Christchurch Hospital. The chairs convert to beds and are much needed for the ward to be able to accommodate parents needing to stay in hospital with their little ones.

Haumia-tiketike set themselves a hefty target – committing \$1600 to the campaign, which would purchase one of these unique chairs. The children spent weeks creating items for sale. Each child I spoke to knew exactly what they were putting their efforts into and could tell me how it would benefit others rather than themselves. They knew that the little bit they raised from selling their individual items would contribute to the overall total raised. They all had fingers crossed that our community would play their part and come along to support the market. And you did. At the end of the afternoon the children had raised over \$2000. But wait, there's more. Throughout the term the children had run a mufti day, and Icey Slicey fundraiser, and held a Spellathon in their studio. When they add these funds raised from these ventures to the market day takings, they have \$3200 in total. Exactly enough to purchase two chairs.

We are so proud of what our children have achieved. They set a goal and the integrity to stick to it, even when it seemed unattainable. They were resilient and kept trying new ways to raise the funds they had committed to providing. They were driven by empathy, and understanding that others have difficult circumstances to overcome and they could help.

We hope now that no one in our Rāwhiti School community ever has to use these chairs.

Wellbeing Project

You will have read in previous newsletters about the Kathleen Liberty wellbeing initiatives we have started to implement at Rāwhiti School this year. These include Play First, Lunch eating together inside, and the Drink to Think programme. Each of these strategies plays a part in helping calm children's brains and better prepare them for learning.

Next term there will be two opportunities here at school for parents to learn more about Kathleen Liberty's research work into the impact that the Canterbury earthquakes have had on children's brain development. On Wednesday 25 October we will be hosting an information session at 9am, and again at 7pm for those who work during the day. Please diary this date and RSVP to the school office so that we have numbers for catering.

Landscaping Project

The new play and explore area is nearing completion and is expected to be in use early next term. We are going to need help in the last weekend of the school holidays to get the area planted and the mulch spread. We are doing this work ourselves to keep the cost of the project manageable.
