Our teachers cannot afford to lose another day's pay - and I know you can't either. As teachers cannot expect to have everything on our 'wish list' straight away - but please believe me when I say this bargaining is not about greed for a bigger pay rise. The conditions around classroom release and extra support for students with additional learning needs have been ignored completely. While we understand that the Minister is saying these things might happen in the future, all of you have children in our classes TODAY who deserve a better deal now.

Schools now have an opportunity to re-think their end of year reporting so that it reflects not just core subjects of reading, writing and maths, but also other equally as important areas of achievement, most notably the key competencies. 
The raffle closes on the 3rd December and will be drawn on the

Thanks to everyone for their donations on the loud shirt mufti day. We raised \$412.60 for this great cause.




Terri in Papatuanuku has had her orange scooter go missing for over a week now. It looks like this one and has her name underneath. If you have seen it around, please return it to her.
