Kylie O'Keefe and **Anna-Belle Graham** have both won positions on the Kā Poupou Reo o Tahu course in 2019 and will each receive fully funded leave for a term to further develop their Māori language. This will be the second year in a row we have had two teachers win positions on this sought after course, which helps us achieve our strategic goal of increasing the number of fluent speakers of te reo on our staff.

Paul Wilkinson has been awarded a Ministry of Education Study Scholarship and will be spending next year away from school completing his Masters Degree. Paul's research will focus on the benefits of using a collaborative and proactive approach to help children solve problems that are causing them to exhibit challenging behaviour. While he is on leave for a full year we will still see Paul each week as he will be teaching in the release team for a day each week.

Eugene Becconsall has been awarded a place on the 2019 Manaiakalani Innovative Teacher programme and will spend a year investigating ways to accelerate learning outcomes for our young people using the Manaiakalani pedagogy. With only 12 positions available nationwide this is a huge achievement for Eugene and we are very proud to have him involved. Don't worry – he won't be going anywhere! Eugene undertakes this work here at school, supported by experts from around the country. He does get a trip to the Google Summit in Sydney at some stage!

We are really proud of the achievements of these teachers. They reflect the quality teaching staff that we have here at school.

2019 Staff

We have very few staff changes this year. Both **Sue Tait** and **Diane Gowland** are retiring from teaching at the end of the year and we will acknowledge their service to the profession at a number of events over the next few weeks.

Amy Parish has won a teaching position at Ohoka School for 2019. Amy has been with us for three years since she graduated from Teachers College. We will miss Amy's enthusiasm and input, especially her involvement with our school sports programme. However, we know Amy will not miss the 45 minute commute every morning and evening and we understand her desire to work closer to home.

In the next section you will see the make-up of each Learning Studio for 2019 along with the teacher placements – so do keep reading.

2019 Learning Studios

The Ministry of Education allocates funding for teaching staff on a ratio of one teacher to every 29 children in Years 4-8. For the last three years the board has funded extra teachers at Rāwihti School in the Year 4-8 section of the school to allow us to maintain a ratio of one teacher to every 24 children. All schools in Christchurch are reporting higher numbers of children in Years 4-8 with both learning and emotional needs and there is increasing evidence to link this to the age these children were at the time of the 2010/2011 earthquakes.

We have held high hopes all year that the government would address the issue of class sizes in the current round of contract negotiations. As you are no doubt aware, the government has refused to do this, and this was a major factor for teachers in deciding to take strike action.

After three years it is not sustainable for us to continue funding additional teachers at this level as it has the roll on effect of adding strain in other areas of the school. Therefore we have made the decision to increase our student – teacher ratio to 1:26 in these areas. This is still well below the level we are funded for and therefore still comes at a cost to the school. However, we know that our children continue to be in a much better situation than most – with many schools now well over the 1:30 ratio.

Final School Accounts

This week you will receive your final school account statement for the year. As of today we still have just on \$12,500 of outstanding activity contributions for school camps, winter sport, performances, class trips, and senior technology. Having to cover this amount as a school will mean that it is likely there will be experiences that we are unable to offer in 2019.

Your contributions for these activities go towards the cost of experiences which are extra to the school's curriculum obligations. We are very mindful of the difficult financial situation some of our families find themselves in and are sensitive to parents who are struggling to afford their contribution to these additional experiences for their children. If you are in a position to be able to clear your account before the end of the school year then we would very much appreciate you doing this. You are most welcome to contact Cheryl in the office to discuss arrangements for managing these costs.

If you had a child involved in the year 7/8 camp last week you will see on your account that there has been an \$11 credit for the cost of one nights accommodation. If your account is in credit then this amount will be rolled over to 2019. If you have other outstanding costs the \$11 will be off-set against these. Again, please contact Cheryl directly if you have any questions.

There are a number of events scheduled over the next 2 weeks. They are all in the school calendar available on the App and our website. All the usual End of Year functions are there – our Supporters Drinks, the Final Assembly, the Rāwhiti Rumbustification, and the Showcase Assembly.

This year we have added something new to our last day of school. Each Learning Studio will hold a poroporoaki at 11am on Friday December 14th. It is a chance for everyone present to acknowledge and express their thanks, thoughts, feelings and to reflect on the school year that has been, in a face-to-face situation. All parents/caregivers/whanau are invited to attend.

There will be one last newsletter for the year on Thursday 13th December. That newsletter will contain all of the 2019 Start of Year information.

We are very much looking forward to seeing you all at our Twilight Fair tomorrow. We know this is going to be a fabulous community event – regardless of the weather!

MADE AWARDS 2018 - Results

Year 7 & 8 Digi Group

In Term 2 we carried out an inquiry about our Digital Identity. First we surveyed some children from Year 1 to Year 8. We found out the most popular social media

sites were Instagram, YouTube and Snapchat. Younger children didn't really know how to go about creating a 'strong' password. We used these survey results to give us an idea for our adverts.

We made two adverts 'The Pass-Bot' (about passwords) and 'Digital Footprints.'

The Pass-Bot made the comparison with underpants to passwords, for example, changing your underpants (passwords) regularly. We made robots out of cardboard, props and backdrops.





We entered our advert into the **MADE Awards 2018.** This is a national competition open to all primary and intermediate schools in New Zealand. MADE stands for Movies And Digital Excellence awards and annually has over 400 - 500 entries in various categories.

The Pass-Bot won **1st place in Commercial Year 7-8 category,** which we are all very proud of. The Digital Footprint came 2nd in the Jenny Griggs Creativity Award.
