From The Principal - Te Pū kāea a te Tumuaki

Kia ora koutou, As the stories of bravery and love filter out to us from the media, I am heartened by people's ability to find the best in horrible situations. Today we had a day of focusing on kindness here at school. Our message to the children was a very simple one - that kindness is free therefore we can show it to others in abundance. Our children wrote messages of kindness and attached these to lollipops which today have been given out to our community, our children, parents and younger siblings who were at school, and our neighbours at the early childhood centre. A group of our senior students went to the New Brighton mall, library and play areas to offer these to members of our wider community. The remainder have been taken to the main memorial site on Rolleston Ave and left for people visiting there.

We continue to reach out to our families to offer our support and add our heartfelt condolences to those who have lost loved ones. Our beautiful city has been through some incredibly traumatic times and many of us are struggling to come to terms with the events of last Friday. As a school leader and a proud Cantabrian my heart is broken that such a tragic act of violence could happen in our city. I stand united with our staff, tamariki and hopefully all of NZ in upholding our schools values of Resilience, Integrity, and Empathy – this week they seem more important and relevant than ever before.

Thank you to all of you who have reached out to our staff this week and showered us with words of kindness and support your words and actions have meant a lot to us. I too wish to

acknowledge and give praise and thanks to our amazing teachers, teacher aides and office staff who showed professionalism, calmness and an abundance of care for your children while they were in the extended lock down on Friday afternoon. Sadly some staff also had to deal with aggressive and threatening behaviour and language from some of our parent community. As government employees we must comply at all time with the instructions of the NZ Police and we will do so again if and when required.

At school, we have been following the advice given to us by the Ministry of Education's experts and this has been working well. This may be of use to you at home as well. They tell us to:

- Keep routines as normal as possible.
- Provide reassurance that the event is over and that they are safe.
- Stay calm and promote a calm environment.
- Limit and monitor exposure to the internet and news sources.
- Do enjoyable things.
- Make sure the information you give children is factual and age appropriate.
- Take time to listen and talk.

Lock Down Procedures

As with any major incident at school, we automatically review our procedures and look to make changes in case we are ever placed in this situation again. We know that the process of releasing children at the end of an extended lockdown needs to be looked at, along with the methods of communication we use to ensure that our messages get to as many people as possible. Once we have reported to the Board of Trustees we will be able to feedback to our community.


Rāwhiti School App
