SCHOOL ACCOUNTS

Accounts have been sent home today. We appreciate your contribution towards your child's school activities. Payment can be made via internet banking 12-3240-0211804-01 or in the school office which has eftpos available. We welcome regular weekly or fortnightly payments.

Winter Sport is into its second term and the cost is \$40 per student. We appreciate prompt payment if you have yet to contribute towards your child playing winter sport.

Basketball for our seniors is an out of school activity and payment was part of your child playing. Please pay this as soon as possible.

Maths Whizz is a maths programme for our Tāwhirimatea year 5 & 6 students. The cost is \$5 per term or \$20 for the year. Your contribution is appreciated.

Dancing with the Stars was a great success. We appreciate your payment of \$10, if your child participated.
