Government Donations Scheme

At its last meeting the Board of Trustees voted to opt into the new Government Donations Scheme for schools in 2020. This means that the school will receive additional funding of \$150 per child for agreeing to stop asking families and whānau for donations.

As this is a new government initiative there are a number of 'unknowns' and so the BOT has agreed to trial this system for the 2020 school year. We think that the new scheme will benefit everyone in our community, however we want to make sure that the we do not have to cut the number of opportunities we offer to children. This means that we will no longer be asking parents to pay for class trips, or for winter sport.

From The Principal— Government Donations Scheme continued ...

Under the new scheme, there are some costs that schools can still ask parents to contribute to:

- Overnight school camps will be exempted from the Donations Scheme, which means that Boards will still be able to ask family/whānau for donations towards school camps that have an overnight component.
- Schools can ask students' family/whānau to purchase a device for their student to use at school (BYOD) and the family/whānau can choose whether to purchase or not.
- Parents will continue to pay for extra-curricula music lessons provided at Rāwhiti School by Amplify School of Music.
- Parents can be asked to pay for visiting drama or music groups, weekend or after hours sports teams, and school dances or social events, participation in these types of activities is voluntary and that participation incurs a charge.
- Programmes such as Mathletics or Maths Whizz can be purchased for home use but families and whānau must be able to choose whether to purchase or not.
- Parents will still be charged for the 'take-home' component of the Year 7/8 technology/manual programme so that children can bring home the things that they make in woodwork, metalwork, fabric technology etc. The foods component of the technology will be covered by the school.


We will make sure that we communicate clearly if there are any costs that parents will be asked to cover.

Purchasing a Chrome Books for your child

Over the past two years teachers at Rāwhiti School and six other schools in the Te Ara Tūhura Cluster have been learning about the Manaiakalani model of teaching and learning called Learn Create Share. So far at Rāwhiti School ten teachers have completed intensive training, and all staff are participating in ongoing professional learning. As teachers are implementing Learn Create Share with their classes they are seeing children becoming more engaged, growing in confidence and making progress, especially in Writing.

As a school we have purchased several sets of Chrome books however we have reached a point where we are not able to provide devices for every child from Year 4 onwards to use. To enable teachers to implement Learn Create Share across the school children we have had children sharing devices and this does place limits on their learning. Children who have a personally owned Chrome book will have the advantage of being able to learn anytime and in any place, including at home.

We are now able to offer parent the opportunity to purchase a Chromebook for their child to use at school in 2020. By purchasing in bulk through the Manaiakalani Trust, Rāwhiti parents can buy a Chromebook for a significantly reduced cost. The bundle will include the Acer C733 and carry bag, 32 GB Local Storage, 3 Year Warranty and 3 Years Insurance - 2 Repair Claims or 1 Replacement. The devices come set up ready to use at school at no additional cost. The cost per device will be \$500. There is the option to pay it off over 1-3 years which would make the weekly payment more achievable for parents. Financing details and other information are in this newsletter.

After much research and testing the Acer C733 has been chosen by the Manaiakalani Trust for 2020 as the device most capable of ensuring teachers can teach and students can Learn Create Share. This managed device enables us to support our learners to make cybersmart choices and develop the knowledge and skills to navigate the complexities of the world wide web. By purchasing our Chromebooks in bulk through the Trust we are able to ensure you are getting the best value for your money. The device and bag have been thoroughly tested in schools and classrooms, there is a 3 year extended warranty and more importantly the 3 year accidental breakage cover with zero excess, as we all know accidents happen.

We manage your child's Chromebook, so we can help minimise issues on the devices and disruptions to learning in the classroom. Devices are enrolled against our school domain and then they show up in our management console. This means that your child can only use a school email on the Chromebook, however all activity they are doing on the Chromebook both at home and school should be absolutely fine using their school email. From there the school is able to centrally manage settings on the devices.

We realise that purchasing a Chrome book for your child may be a challenge however the investment you make will provide them with a proven advantage for learning. It <u>is not</u> a compulsory requirement for children to have their own device.
