Health Department guidelines include:

Teacher Only Days

You may remember that last year when teachers were negotiating their pay claim that the Government offered 8 Teacher Only Days over three years as part of the settlement. The BOT has approved the use of three of these days this year:

Tuesday, April 28th

- Tuesday, April 28^t
- Friday, May 29th
- Monday, November 16th.



School will be officially closed on each of these dates. All of these dates have been chosen to work around an existing public holiday so that families can choose to take advantage of an even longer weekend.

The second Teacher Only Day will see teachers from all of the schools in our cluster gathering together to enhance their practice in the teaching of Reading. Our cluster is working extremely well together gathering data from our learners and using this information to inform our practice. This is a huge advantage of belonging to the Manaiakalani Outreach Programmes and we are very grateful for the support we get from being involved in this project. The Woolf Fisher Research Centre collates and analyses our data and it is from here that we are able to observe trends and work together to ensure that **Deliberate Teacher Actions** that **cause learning** are evident in our practice in all areas of the curriculum we teach.

Cell Phones At School

If your child brings a cell phone to school each day, please remind them that it is to remain in their bag for the duration of the school day. Should a child need to contact their family for any reason, they are to use the phone in their Learning Studio once they have gained permission from a teacher. If a child is feeling unwell it is important that he/she follows our sick bay procedures and if he/she needs to go home, someone from the school office will notify you. This helps us to ensure we are fully aware if a child leaves the school site in the course of the day. All children leaving our site need to be signed out at the office.

Library Donation



We have received a

very generous donation, from Alice McDonaugh, of \$5000 for purchasing library books.

Miss McDonaugh was the Infant Mistress at North New Brighton School for 20 years from the mid 50's to the mid 70's. Alice kept in touch with other past staff from North New Brighton School and continued to be interested when she left and kept up to date with our merger process.

Alice passed away at the age of 94 in 2019.

Eco-Action satellite nursery

Rawhiti School is now a satellite nursery for Eco-Action. We have partnered with 11 other schools around our city to care for and grow native seedlings. The native plant seeds are sourced from Travis Wetlands, germinated and potted by student volunteers from Shirley Boys' High and Christs College. Our job is to care for the small plants and grow them on till they are ready to be put back into the ground. Thanks to Eco-Action we have also been gifted all the equipment we will need to ensure we can look after these seedlings.

Eco-sourcing means plants are adapted to their local environment and are more likely to grow well. These native plants provide year-round food and habitat for native birds and other fauna like insects, lizards and invertebrates. We are very much looking forward to being involved in the re-planting of these native plants when they are ready.
