From The Principal - Te Pū kāea a te Tumuaki

Kia ora koutou

Welcome back to school. I hope you all had a lovely break with your family and managed to get away, something we were not able to do in April. On Monday we welcomed our new families with a Mihi Whakatau in the school hall. We used to do this just once a year, but we will now be having a Mihi Whakatau on the first day of every new term as it is important to welcome people at the start of their time in our learning community. Our new arrivals on Monday took our total school roll to 560.

This term the learning across the school is based on the Science curriculum and children will be looking at different aspects of our learning concept, Growing, through a science lens. This will look different in each studio, and includes concepts such as:

- Why insects, plants and bacteria are important to us.
- Growth processes and how species diversify over time.
- Life cycles, eco systems and food webs.
- How seasonal changes influence the growth and development of plants.
- The natural conditions that let animals and plants grow successfully in our local environment.

Next week our littlest learners are launching into Term 3 with trips to the EcoDepot to find out about worms. They will be building worm farms and learning about what worms do, what they need and how

we can care for them. I wonder what living things Rongo-mā-tāne will be interested in learning about and caring for next?



Hero

I hope you have had a chance to take a look at your child's maths achievement and goals in our new learning app, Hero. You need to set up an account to be able to do this and there is a link on the front page of our website if you have not done this already.

This term, our teachers will be focusing on getting all of our writing achievement information into Hero for you, and you will also be able to see how your child is getting on with the Measurement concepts being taught in maths across the school for the first half of this term. We will let you know when there is new content to check out.

Healthy Active Learning Initiative

We are welcoming a team from Massey University to Rāwhiti School next week. They will be looking at healthy eating and physical activity to see how a government initiative called Healthy Active Learning is helping children to be active and eat healthy food.

The team from Massey University will be at our school for two weeks conducting surveys about physical activity, motivation and engagement with learning with a selection of students. Students may also be asked to wear a watch-type device to get an idea of how active our children are and how much they sleep. Our students could also be asked to take part in a focus group to talk about being active.

Parents and whanau can take part too, the team want to get parent's perspectives on physical activity and healthy eating at school.

We will be sending out the consent forms soon, or you can collect them from the team early next week. Those who take part go in the draw to win a \$100 supermarket voucher.

Teachers as Learners

As part of our involvement in the Manaiakalani Outreach Programme our teachers also have the opportunity to improve their own digital fluency and use of

Google tools in the classroom and work towards becoming a Level 1 Google Certified Educator. Last term seven more of our staff gained this qualification. Congratulations to Paul, Helen P, Elizabeth, Nogo, Nicole, Kylie, and Rachel B.

This term I am joining 6 other members of staff and taking part in the Digital Fluency Intensive, therefore I will not be available at school on Fridays. Paul and Helen will be here to help you if you need support with anything.

Parking Outside The School Gate

The Christchurch City Council has advised that they will be designating 2 spaces outside our school as accessible parking for mobility card holders accessing the school, particularly during school pick up / drop off times. This is great news, and something we have been wanting for quite some time. We will let you know when the change has been made.



All of the parking restrictions outside of the school – **yellow lines, bus stop and 5 minute parking limits** – are designated by the Christchurch City Council, not the school, and therefore you can incur a parking infringement notice for ignoring the requirements.

Arriving Early

Children can come onto our school grounds and straight into the Learning Studios from 8.30am each morning. If children arrive before 8.30am they have to wait outside the school gates – which is never very nice if it is particularly frosty, or raining. Please do not leave your child standing outside the gates - time your arrival for 8.30am onwards.

We are offering students in Years 3-8, who have either been nominated by their studio teacher/s or who have put their name forward, the opportunity to enter the following competitions that are run by the University of New South Wales.

The ICAS Assessments are all completed as online tests, designed to recognise and reward academic excellence. The ICAS Assessments series is designed to assess your students' ability to apply classroom learning in new contexts, using higher-order thinking and problem-solving skills. The students will sit the online assessment here at school later this term.

Bus Stop Outside School



A friendly reminder to not park in the bus stop parks. These are reserved for buses and the afterschool programme pickups. We try
