From The Principal - Te Pū kāea a te Tumuaki

Kia ora koutou, It has been a very interesting term with Covid Alert Levels, getting everyone settled back at school, launching our new Hero reporting system, and international landscaping awards! I'd like to thank you all for your support this term and hoping we can have one that has some sense of normality in Term 3 !!

After reading an article in The Press last weekend, I am handing the editorial pen over to a group of our Year 7 and 8 students - **Clara, Jasmin, Caitlyn, Sophie, Abe, Jessica, Mak, Skye, Lily and Aliana** – who have responded beautifully to the derogatory comments written about the suburb of New Brighton. I will also be submitting this as a letter to the Editor of the Christchurch Press on their behalf. I think you will agree, they present a compelling and mature argument. Please read below:

We have read the article "Pathetic intervention can't save 'wreck' of a Christchurch suburb, expert says", published on Stuff, on the 27th of June 2020 and we are outraged by the disrespect shown to our people and our suburb. Dr Greg Clydesdale referred to our community as a "wreck", "disgusting" and called it "one of the worst places in Christchurch." He has judged New Brighton by its cover without knowing what it's really like.

Our New Brighton is a loving, friendly, community. We are a diverse community. We are not a community of cookie cutter houses and people. We are passionate about our people, our uniqueness, our schools, our beach, our sports clubs, our community gardens, our wildlife, our Saturday markets, our street art, our community groups, Youth Alive, our pier, our library, our river, our history, and our future.

We are not a 'wreck', we are a community that keeps rising up, despite the challenges we have been through, like a phoenix rising from the ashes. Our suburb has a long, important history as a part of Christchurch. We may have wounds, but they will heal over time. They are another part of our story. Like the Japanese art of Kintsugi, where broken pottery is repaired with gold paint to tell and celebrate its story, our wounds are a part of our community, our people are our gold paint.
