# HERO

We have assisted a handful of families who were unable to log in to HERO which is our student management, school reporting, and communication system. It has now been up and running since the end of last term. Have you tried to log in? If not, please click, <u>https://hero.linc-ed.com/parents/</u>, and follow the instructions.

If your email address has changed within the last month then please advise the office as your username/email for Hero must match the email address we have for you in our school records.

If you need any additional help, feel free to email Kim on <u>admin@rawhiti.school.nz</u> and she will assist you.

We have heard that some parents have not been receiving information or communication about certain events and the main reason for this is because they have not tried to log into Hero. Another reason could be that the email from Hero is going into a Spam folder or the Hero App notification setting is not turned on when using a phone.

We highly recommend installing the Hero app on your phone and making sure your notifications are switched on. This is how you will receive news, updates, and information regarding events, trips and activities throughout the year for your child.

## **Personal Digital Devices**

The Board of Trustees has updated its policy on student use of personal digital devices at school. A personal digital device is any privately owned digital device that is not part of a school-approved bring your own Chromebook programme. This includes cellphones, smartwatches, tablets, laptops, handheld PCs and consoles, portable music players, e-readers, and other similar devices.

Rāwhiti School does not recommend that students bring personal digital devices to school. These are not necessary to have during the day. However, we understand that some parents like their children to have a device to communicate with them after school.

We discuss the school rules about personal digital devices at the beginning of the year, and throughout the year as needed.

If a student does bring a personal digital device to school, the following guidelines apply:

- The school does not accept responsibility for lost, damaged, or stolen personal digital devices.
- The device should be kept turned off and out of sight.
- Devices may not be used at break times.
- Personal digital devices are not to be used for a learning activities.

Students may take certain digital devices on EOTC activities, but should check whether their device is allowed before the activity commences. These guidelines and other relevant school policies apply. If a parent needs to contact their child urgently during the day, they should call the office.

### Inappropriate use

If a student is observed using a personal digital device inappropriately, the student must hand it to a staff member immediately when asked. If possible, students should lock their device before handing it to staff. The device will be kept in the office and can be collected by the student at the end of the day.

Inappropriate use of a personal digital device may include:

- using the device when not permitted.
- any sort of bullying, including cyberbullying, e.g. disrespectful messages about staff or other students.
- taking photos or videos of other people without their permission.
- forwarding inappropriate messages or content.

# Parking Outside The School Gate



While the parking design on Leaver Terrace is not neces-

sarily perfect, 99% of the time it is not the engineering that is the issue but road users behaviour and lack of patience and consideration for others that is the issue.

All of the parking restrictions outside of the school – yellow lines, bus stop and 5 minute parking limits – are designated by the Christchurch City Council, not the school, and therefore you can incur a parking infringement notice for ignoring the requirements. ## **Your School Account**



Your child's school account is now available to view on Hero and has also been emailed to you if you have an amount owing.

If you have logged in to Hero, click on the 3 lines (menu) top left of the screen, then touch "Finance" and your statement will be there.

The Rawhiti School Board of Trustees has opted in to the MOE School Donation Scheme this year which means we will receive additional funds as part of the operating grant in 2020. We will not be asking for donations or fees for normal everyday school curriculum activities because the following will be automatically covered by the Ministry of Education Donation Scheme:

- Group trips and excursions relating to curriculum delivery
- Google account management
- Family school donation
- Swimming.

We can continue to request payment contributions for optional activities such as winter sports, overnight camps, and the take-home component of the Year 7/8 technology programme.

Items that are required to be paid in full because they are extra curricular activities include Kiwi Competition, ICAS, Adrenaline Forest, Basketball, Skiing and skiing extras, Touch Rugby, Koru Games, Children's University, Uniforms and Dancing with the Stars.




