From The Principal - Te Pū kāea a te Tumuaki

Kia ora koutou, It has been a busy two weeks for our tamariki and their kaiako. There are currently lots of children going out of the school on trips to various locations, all linked to our school-wide learning theme of Growing. Our cluster winter sports tournament for Years 5-8 also kicked off last week, making for a full on Friday afternoon. Then last night we had dinner with members of our Pasifika community to celebrate Cook Island Language Week.

I reflect that we can only do these things because our country was super vigilant about Covid-19 and because members of the community sacrificed a lot so that we can now be in Alert Level 1. As we are constantly being reminded, we need to stay vigilant so please:

- Use the Contract Tracing App when you come onto school grounds.
- Keep up the handwashing hygiene practices we are.
- Keep sick children at home remember the 48 hour rule.
- Get tested if you/your children have any symptoms of Covid.

Of course, there are many other things that pose a threat to children's health and safety – one of them being traffic. This week I received a call from a very distressed motorist who was driving down Bowhill Road after school when a Rāwhiti child ran out onto the road through backed up traffic and straight in front of her car – requiring her to take immediate evasive action to avoid running him over. Needless to say, the motorist was badly shaken. Could you please remind your children about the importance of crossing roads carefully and safely. This lad was literally a few metres away from a pedestrian crossing but ran through the traffic instead – and the results could have been disastrous.

Spam Comments on Student Blogs

Currently, we are noticing a random increase in spam on some of our learners blogs. An increase in spam on a student's blog may be due to learners clicking on links that they do not know, or spambots sending unsolicited spam out randomly. Often the spam is advertising and is intended to get you to click through to another website



When we find this spam, the teacher will mark it as spam on the blog. This lets Google know it is spam and they deal with it. Occasionally however, spam comments may slip through.

If you notice any spam on your child's blog, please let their teacher know, so they can manage it quickly. If your child has unsolicited spam coming onto their blog regularly, we will take further steps to reduce it. To help with the management of this spam please remind your child not to click on any links within a message that they are uncertain of.

Having a blog which is managed by the teacher and school allows us a teaching opportunity where we can empower your children to make smart choices when interacting with others online and know what to do when things go wrong.

Children can come onto our school grounds and straight into the Learn-

Parking Outside The School Gate

While the parking design on Leaver Terrace is not necessarily perfect, 99% of the time

All of the parking restrictions outside of the school – yellow lines, bus stop and 5 minute parking limits – are designated by the Christchurch City Council, not the school, and therefore you can incur a parking infringement notice for ignoring the requirements. If you see parking that endangers our children then please feel free to report it to the City Council.

The Rawhiti School Board of Trustees has opted in to the Ministry of Education School Donation Scheme this year.





