# From The Principal continued ...

# **Teacher Only Day this Term**

# Reporting in Hero

At the end of last term we published, via the Hero app, at least 2 examples of children's maths work this term and an up-to-date sample of their writing. These posts came with a short explanation as to what the piece of learning is showing, and also referenced your child's particular learning goals.

You may have noticed that a photo or a piece of work that you could see at the end of last term is now missing. This has been caused by a 'glitch' in the Hero server storage over the holiday break and is something that it outside of our control. Hero is now in the process of reloading any missing photos so you will see these start to reappear over the next few weeks.

This term you will see teachers continuing to post pieces of maths and literacy evidence, and you will also start to see your child's reading goals and achievements showing in Hero.

# Planning for 2021

We are once again at the time of the year when we start planning the structure of our Learning Studios for next year, and the placement of both teachers and students within teams.

As our school is arranged into collaborative teaching teams the process of organising children into studio groups is quite different to the task of drawing up traditional class lists. A lot of professional thought goes into placing children into studio groups with teachers we think they will form a strong connection with. However, we don't always get this right. 


### SUCCESS@RAWHITI



### Hats for Term 4


Our Sun Smart policy requires all children to wear a Rāwhiti School sunhat in Terms 1 and 4.

# **Canterbury Rams Basketball Mentoring**

As part of our involvement in the Healthy Active Learning Initiative and Sport NZ, we

have our first intake on the basketball mentoring programme. We will be running a Year 5/6 group and Year 7/8 group each term. The first groups have already started, but we know there are many more students interested in places for 2021.

The CRBF basketball mentoring program involves groups of 12 children participating in a weekly 45-50 minute session with two Canterbury Rams players/coaches attending each session. The students in these groups will not only benefit from the physical activity and the coaching of basketball skills but the benefits of having a mentoring role model they look up too.

# **Your School Accounts**

Your child's school account is now available to view on Hero - if you haven't already downloaded the Hero app please do so. If you are having trouble viewing, contact Kim in the office.

If you have logged in to Hero, click on the 3 lines (menu) top left of the screen, then touch "Finance" and your statement will be there.

The Rawhiti School Board of Trustees has opted in to the Ministry of Education School Donation Scheme this year. The school will now receive additional funds as part of the operating grant in 2020. This means that we will not be asking for donations or fees for normal everyday school curriculum activities. The following will be automatically covered by the Ministry of Education Donation Scheme:

- · Group trips and excursions relating to curriculum delivery
- · Google account management
- · Family school donation
- · Swimming.

We can continue to request payment contributions for optional activities such as **winter sports teams**, **camps with an overnight component**, and the take-home component of the **Year 7/8 technology programme**.

# Rāwhiti School Library

Over the last three years we have been part of the Te Ara Tuhura Cluster and have been learning about the Manaiakalani model of teaching and learning called Learn Create Share. This year we've had Mark Maddren and Sharon Spragg working with specific teachers at Rāwhiti School. They have been providing professional development to implement Manaiakalani's model of teaching and learning with students.

Children who have a personally owned Chromebook will have the advantage of being able to learn anytime and in any place, including at home. We are now able to offer parents the opportunity to purchase a Chromebook for their child to use at school in 2021.

The bundle will include the Acer C733 and carry bag, 32 GB Local Storage, 3 Year Warranty and 3 Years Insurance - 2 Repair Claims or 1 Replacement. The devices comes set up ready to use at school at no additional cost. The cost per device will be \$520 (including GST).

Mark will share information about Learn Create Share, how the Chromebook can support our learners to develop the knowledge and skills to navigate the complexities of the world wide web and details about the Chromebook package. He will also answer any questions.
