Our swimming pool opened this week – an indication that summer is just around the corner! We are one of the few primary schools in Christchurch that still operates its own pool and the resource is extremely precious to us. It causes us great distress to hear about children and young people climbing into the pool enclosure in the weekend and evenings. Often these are older teenagers, but on occasions, some of our own students decide they would like a 'free' swim. The gates are locked and the fences are high for a reason – safety.

We very much appreciate our neighbours and friends of the school who keep an eye on the pool at nights and weekends and contact the police or Community Watch when they see young people trespassing.

Ka Ora, Ka Ako - Healthy School Lunches Programme

The Government is currently introducing a free, healthy, daily school lunch in some schools for all students. We are really excited to let you know that our school will be joining the free lunch programme from Term 1, 2021.



We know that some of you will have been particularly affected by the economic impact of the COVID-19 pandemic. Offering a lunch for all our children will go some way to helping families and whanau to support their children and tamariki. This is why we have decided to take part in this programme. The lunches will be available for all our students. While we know there are hungry children in every community, we do not always know who they are. Providing a lunch to every child means we do not need to single-out those who need it more than others. However, lunches are not compulsory, and you can continue to provide your child's own lunch if you wish.

Lunches will cater for the diet, health and cultural needs of our students, and we will work with suppliers and the Ministry of Education to make sure they are healthy and nutritious. All suppliers will be required to meet New Zealand food safety standards.

Right now, we are working with the Ministry of Education on the best way to meet our school's needs. So far, we have opted to join a group of schools and will soon know who our supplier will be once the Ministry's open tender processes have been completed



Thinking of buying a Chromebook for your child for 2021

Children who have a personally owned Chromebook will have the advantage of being able to learn anytime and in any place, including at home. We are now able to offer parents the opportunity to purchase a Chromebook for their child to use at school in 2021.

The bundle will include the Acer C733 and carry bag, 32 GB Local Storage, 3 Year Warranty and 3 Years Insurance - 2 Repair Claims or 1 Replacement. The devices comes set up ready to use at school at no additional cost. The cost per device will be \$520 (including GST).

If you order before **Friday 28 November 2020** the Chromebook will be delivered before the end of the school year. Orders after this date will be held until school opens in 2021.

Grow Waitaha DigiAwards 2020


