## **Concerns, Complaints, and Communication**

In our experience, when parents have a concern that relates to their child at school - whether it's pastoral, curriculum or staffing in nature –it can be most quickly resolved by talking first to the most appropriate person. Your starting point will usually be the classroom teacher. In this newsletter you will find a flowchart attached outlining who the most appropriate person will be. Problems are usually remedied easily; rumours are often ill founded; policies and practice are sometimes misunderstood; errors, shortcomings and wrongs should be corrected immediately. Please do not let a little concern become a major worry – we are always happy to listen and work with you to resolve an issue.

Please remember that our teachers are also husbands, wives, parents and members of their community and they need time to undertake these roles as well. Our teachers are highly committed and they work very hard, but they also need to finish work at a reasonable time each day. If you email a staff member in the evening please do not expect an immediate response. We ask our teachers to check their emails at the end of the school day and when they arrive in the morning. #### Child Absence



Just a reminder that if your child is not going to be coming to school please contact the office before 9am with your child's name and reason for absence by one of the following methods:

Currently if you do not contact the school, you will receive a text from us, which you can reply to. If you don't reply to the text we will call you to follow up on the absence.

You can also contact the office if your child will be away for a long period of time and then you won't have to contact us every day of their absence.



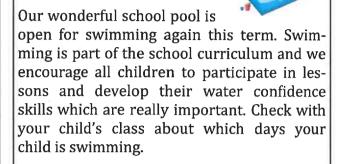
# Healthy School Lunches Programme

As most of you are aware Rāwhiti School is part of the Healthy School Lunches programme this year. Lunch

is provided for every child however as they iron out the logistics of the production and delivery some of the special dietary requests have not been able to be fulfilled but hopefully by next week that will be changed.

If your child has food allergies or special dietary requirements please communicate these to the school office via email admin@rawhiti.school.nz. Once we have a new request, it takes 3-5 days for the new request to be processed so please ensure you still send your child to school with lunch until we can confirm.

Please ensure that togs, towel, goggles etc are all named. The pool is also open at lunch times for Year 4 - 8 children.

#### Teacher Release

One condition in the New Zealand Primary teachers employment agreement is regular classroom release time. Our teachers take this non-contact time once a fortnight and use it for planning, collecting and analysing data and observing best practice.

On top of this, our first year beginning teachers are released for a day a week and our second year teachers one day a fortnight to ensure they are mentored and supported during their first two years.

Our Team Leaders are also released regularly so they can carry out their responsibilities. We are very fortunate to have a strong team of part-time teachers who create engaging programmes and develop strong relationships with our learners. Elizabeth Kazmierczak leads our fantastic release team of

Caroline Briggs, Jen Evans, Nicole Johnson, Marcella Wood, and Louise Wynn.



## Year 7/8 Technology Education

Our Year 7 & 8 students attend Technology lessons offsite at Linwood College, on the former Phillipstwon School site in Nursery Road every Thursday morning. The bus leaves from school at 8:30am.

The curriculum has been developed in line with the 'Technology' and 'Health and Physical Education' aspects of the New Zealand Curriculum. Their aim is to provide students with a variety of learning experiences that will enable them to thrive in a rapidly changing world. The standard two-year programme consists of five modules each year covering: Food and Nutrition, Fabrics, Wood, Electronics, Robotics, Product Design, DigiTech

The student material fees cover the costs of materials and foods used while at the centre. The student material fee for 2021 is \$50 including GST for both Year 7 & Year 8 students. This will show on your school account.

## Year 5 & 6 Camp

If you have a child in Year 5 and/or 6 they should have brought home a notice with some details about their camp, being held at Waipara Adventure Centre from Mon 22—Wed 24 March for Year 5s, and Wed 24—Fri 26 March for Year 6s.

The cost for camp will be \$65 per child. This covers the accommodation, bus and food. This payment will need to be made before the **17th of March please.** 

## Scooters, skateboards and bikes

Children may bring scooters, skateboards and bikes to school. These come to school at your own risk and we strongly encourage children to lock them to the available stands. We have an engraving machine at school and are quite happy to engrave names into scooters or skateboards. ## **Ministry of Education School Donations Scheme**

The Rāwhiti School Board of Trustees has again opted in to the Ministry of Education School Donation Scheme. The school will receive additional funds as part of the operating grant. This means that this year we will not be asking for donations or fees for normal everyday school curriculum activities.

The following will be automatically covered by the Ministry of Education Donation Scheme:

- Group trips and excursions relating to curriculum delivery
- · Google account management
- Family school donation
- Swimming.

We can continue to request payment contributions for optional activities such as winter sports teams, camps with an overnight component, and the take-home component of the Year 7/8 technology programme at Linwood College.

We have information about the donations scheme on our school website under "General Information FAQs" and "Donations".

#### Uniform

Wearing the Rāwhiti uniform is compulsory and is an important part of helping children develop a sense of belonging at school. Please ensure all items of clothing are labelled so lost items can be returned to their owner.

Our uniform is a regulation polo shirt and fleece, or black senior jacket (Yr7&8 only) with a plain black bottom half. Students may wear a plain black or white thermal under their polo if they require an extra layer. Children will be asked to remove their non-regulation uniform. This includes coloured items under their polo shirts and non-regulation sweatshirts. Information about senior jackets for Year 7s will be sent out next week.

Jeans, jandals, boots and shoes with heels are not permitted. Wheelie shoes can be brought to school but can only be used across the bridges on the court area.

#### Sunhats

School uniform sunhats must be worn outside during Term 1. Hats are available from the school office for \$12.50.

#### COVID19

I can reassure you that we will continue to regularly clean all parts of our school.

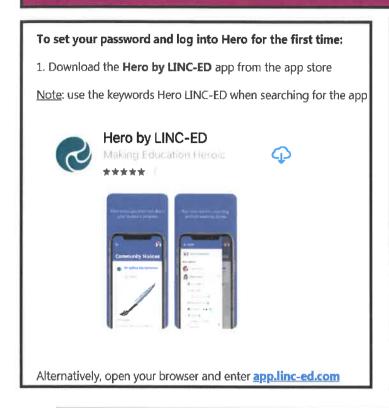
## Update on our penguin

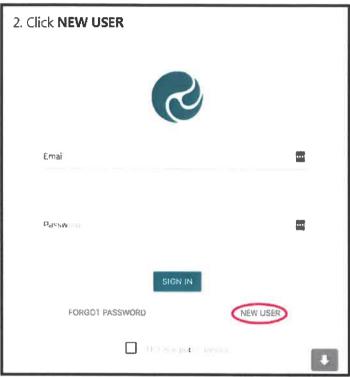

At Rāwhiti School we believe learning happens everywhere. Often the best learning is a result of shared experiences and conversations. Spending time together as a family/whānau and having fun is the best home learning you can do with your child. Here are some things you might like to try at home together.

Ask your mother or father or another family member to discuss with you the day that you were born.  Where were you born?  Who was there?  Did anything out of the ordinary happen?  How did your family feel when they first got to see you?	Cook a meal together that celebrates your family's cultural identity.	Make a jigsaw puzzle about your family. How do you all fit together? Make a paper - chain of your friends or whānau	Learn, practise or extend your pepeha https://pepeha.nz/create-pepeha	Read or listen to a Māori legend. If yes, what is it and if no, can you create one to share?
