From The Deputy Principals

Kia ora koutou,

Wow! There is so much going on. Students have been involved in Kelly Sport lessons, gymnastic sessions, swimming and mindfulness sessions this term. We are very fortunate to have great support from many organisations outside school that offer these extraordinary opportunities to our students.

This week we have had a large number of students representing Rāwhiti both at the eastern zone swimming zones, and today a group of Y7&8 students completed the Police Competency challenge (PCT).

As this is the first year for a while that the Easter holiday is in the school term, we thought we should remind




you all that school is closed for 3 days around the holiday. The three days school will be closed are **Friday 2nd, Monday 5th & Tuesday 6th April**.

Teacher Only Days 2021

In 2019 the Ministry of Education granted schools 8 Teacher Only Days to be used during the term of the current collective agreement. Because of the Covid disruption in 2020 we have only used one day so far.

These days are to provide teachers and principals with additional time to:

- Refresh and deepen their knowledge and practice around the local curriculum (within the context of the removal of national standards)
- Strengthen their understanding of the use of assessment tools for learning and teaching
- Respond to the recommendations of the education work programme in the Curriculum, Progress and Achievement (CPA) Report
- Familiarise themselves with curriculum work changes that will become available over the term of the collective agreements.

At Rāwhiti School we have decided to spread these days out across the year and where possible to attach them to a long weekend. In 2021 there will be three teacher only days on:

- Friday 4th June
- Friday 27th August
- Thursday 11th November.

Gymnastics

We are very fortunate to be having lessons at the Christchurch School of Gymnastics. These lessons are free for all of our students. Students have been learning skills on the beam, ropes, rings, trampoline, and floor mats. Thanks to all the parents who are coming along to support and to help with walking the students to and from QE2 park safely.



Earthquake



If we have an earthquake children will be kept safely at school until parents or other emergency contacts are able to get to school. We will attempt to communicate with parents via the Hero app or text messaging if this is possible.

Tsunami Evacuation Procedures

In the event of a tsunami warning the following procedures will be followed.

If we receive warning that a tsunami is predicted and evacuation is advised:

- Parents will be informed that we have received an evacuation notification from Civil Defence. This information will be sent by text and notifications will also be posted on our school website, on Facebook, and via the Rāwhiti School Hero App.
- Teachers will be notified and classes will assemble on the netball courts. Teachers will have full class lists that include parent/caregiver details, and emergency contacts.
- Depending on the size of the shake will depend on whether we are required to evacuate to somewhere further away. **Civil Defence will let us know if we need to evacuate for a distant earthquake or we will follow the "Long, Strong, Get gone" message.**
- If we need to evacuate, once rolls have been checked classes will begin the walk to either Shirley Boys High School/Avonside Girls High School or Waitakiri School, 170 Burwood Road if we need to move further inland. **This is the destination advised by Civil Defence**.
- Teachers will maintain class lists of students collected by parents or nominated emergency contacts, including who students have gone home with and the time. Students may only be uplifted by a parent/caregiver, or one of the emergency contacts identified in our database.
- Special needs students who have been identified with mobility difficulties will be transported in the Rāwhiti School vans, driven by the Learning Support Coordinator or the Caretaker.
- The Principal or a Deputy Principal will follow up at the rear in a vehicle, with the daily roll, and first aid (including Epi Pens for students with life threatening allergies) and communication resources.

Here is a map showing the evacuation zones in our area:

Canterbury Tsunami Evacuation Zones

If you feel a long (more than a minute) or a strong (hard to stand up) earthquake, leave the red and orange evacuation zones immediately. Do not wait for an official warning, sirens, an emergency mobile alert, or for someone to tell you to go. Stay out of the zone until you are told it is safe to go back.

You only need to evacuate the <u>yellow</u> zone if you are told to in an official warning.

In an official warning you will be told which zones to evacuate.

Note that in most other parts of New Zealand you need to evacuate all zones (including yellow) if you feel a long or strong earthquake. You should check out the tsunami evacuation zones and what they mean if you are near the coast in other parts of New Zealand.

Red zone: Areas most likely to be affected by a tsunami, including small tsunamis that might not flood land but may cause strong currents and surges in the water. This includes the sea, harbours, lagoons, estuaries, beaches and river mouths. Evacuate this zone if you feel a long or strong earthquake, or if you are

(Yellow = only evacuate if Civil Defence advises to do so)

If we receive notification during the school day of an event of distant origin e.g. earthquake in South America, with a warning time of 10 or more hours:


- •Parents will be notified by email, website, Facebook, and Rāwhiti School Hero App so that they can make their own decision as to whether they uplift their child from school.
- •We will remain open for the school day.
- •We will track events as they develop throughout the day in order to make an informed decision about school closure.

What can you do to help?

Update your contact details with the office:

- •Update emergency contacts and their contact information
- •Download the Hero app

•If there is a long or strong earthquake or tsunami warning understand that we will be moving to Avonside Girls/Shirley Boys High Schools or Waitakiri School if we need to move further inland.





Home Learning

Home learning is an extension of the school programme and supports, enhances, and consolidates teaching and learning. It provides a positive link between home and school.

Teachers:

- outline expectations, routines, and suggested time requirements for home learning to students and parents at the start of the year
- set home learning that reflects students' individual needs and changing ages and stages, and reinforces teaching and learning
- set home learning that incorporates the vision, values, key competencies, essential learning areas and principles as expressed in The New Zealand Curriculum or Te Marautanga o Aotearoa
- ensure students understand their home learning tasks and can work independently, where possible communicate home learning concerns to parents.
- Students:
- are responsible for their own home learning
- understand their home learning tasks and work as independently as possible.
- Parents:
- encourage and support their children
- provide feedback to the child and the teacher

communicate with the teacher if their child is unable to complete the home learning, or if family or other circumstances take priority.
