From The Principal - Te Pū kāea a te Tumuaki

Kia ora koutou—Welcome to Term 2. I hope you managed to enjoy some of the glorious week autumn weather with your children during the holidays.



I am really enjoying being back at school after my sabbatical break and have loved spending time in some of the Learning Studios over the last two weeks. The children in Papatūānuku were confidently choosing their own learning activities for the session and the ukulele group were proving to be quick learners. During literacy time in Tāne Mahuta I was really impressed with the variety of strategies children were using to work through the various tasks and the obvious sense of purpose. Junior Choir is new this year and is very popular, with over 90 Y1-3 children involved. During my first visit they were all focussed on their vocal under exercises the expert tuition of Issie. from Papatūānuku.

The purpose of principal sabbatical is to provide a term's leave for school leaders to undertake professional learning, reflection and rejuvenation. There is a requirement to publish the findings of this study and make it available for other school leaders within New Zealand. The research topic for my sabbatical centred on examining the complex issues arising from the process of merging three schools into one in post-earthquake Christchurch and identifying successful change management strategies to support such a process. It is important that our schools unique story not be forgotten, that the hard work of everyone involved is acknowledged, and that others might learn from our experience.



Teacher Only Day—Friday 4th June



Dear Parents/caregivers

Your child's school is participating in the **HELL Pizza Reading Challenge**, which is being run in conjunction with the 2021 New Zealand Book Awards for Children and Young Adults.

The HELL Reading Challenge is a highly successful programme that gets kids reading and enjoying the pleasures of books with free pizza rewards.

How the Reading Challenge works:

Children are being given "pizza wheels". Every time they finish a book, a slice of the wheel gets clicked off or signed by a teacher or librarian. When they have finished seven books, they can take their completed pizza wheel to any HELL Pizza outlet and redeem it for a free 333 Pizza.

Here are the rules:


- Each pizza wheel is good for one 333 Kids' Pizza from any HELL Pizza outlet nationwide
