From The Principal - Te Pū kāea a te Tumuaki

Kia ora koutou

I am very much enjoying being back at school and re-connecting with children across the Learning Studios. This week I managed to squeeze in some time in Tāwhirimātea during their afternoon programme and there was such a lot on offer for the learners art, drama and dance. I was also impressed with the way children were volunteering at the end of the day to take care of all of the tasks involved in readying the studio for the next day of learning.

Last Friday we celebrated Healthy Active Living in several forms.

It was Pink Shirt Day and, as a school, we raised \$580 to support the Mental Health Foundation in the work they do to create schools, workplaces, communities and whānau where everyone feels safe, valued and respected. Our senior students wrote special messages around our school to remind everyone of the need to be kind to people, no matter who they are.

Our annual school Cross Country was the big event of the day. In preparation for this, students had been taking part in a Run Around New Zealand event, where they could complete a 1km circuit around the school ground and add their efforts to the schools collective total. So many children took part that it only took our school 4 days to run the length of the country!

Thanks to all of our parents and caregivers who turned out to support children in the Cross Country. It was delightful to see our oldest students completing the race with their junior buddies. Some of our seniors completed the course five times!

You will all be aware of the incident that recently took place in the Dunedin Countdown. Over the following days there were a number of reports in the media about how Countdown staff are regularly on the receiving end of both physical and verbal abuse from customers. A group of our senior students

were, like you, disappointed that supermarket staff would be treated in this way, and decided to take action.

They collected messages of support for our local Countdown staff from across the school and collated them into a scrapbook, and then made a short movie of positive messages from our students. On Wednesday morning they presented these to the team at our local supermarket during their morning staff meeting. 
The skateboard will be joined by two of New Zealand's top skateboarders Matt Markland and Bowman Hansen.
