From The Principal continued ...

Thank you to our staff who have plans in place and are ready and willing to help out whereever they can, and for being caring and courageous as we all navigate these challenging times.

We do want to reassure you that the school has a plan in place for keeping the school open and managing student learning as the absence numbers for children and teachers increase. Each Learning Studio is now offering a 'Hybrid' model of learning - which means that as well as the Learning Studios operating each day, there is on-line learning available to sick and isolating children, and Google Meets have been scheduled for children to connect with their teachers. A hard-pack of learning materials is available from the office for children who need to be at home for 7 days if you can't access online learning.

It may be necessary next week for children to spend time in a different Learning Studio, with teachers other than their own, as we re-organise the school each day to cater for staff and student absences.

PB4L

This year our staff are involved in the PB4L professional development contract with the Ministry of Education. Paul Wilkinson and Helen Hogarth will be leading this project here at school.

The acronym PB4L stands for Positive Behaviour for Learning. It is a school wide framework which aims to promote appropriate behaviour in a positive manner that is non-threatening and supportive of all students and staff. It aims to minimise problematic behaviours and maximise and celebrate positive social and academic student behaviours. Positive Behaviour for Learning is based on more than twenty years research in creating positive school cultures, in thousands of schools across Canada, Norway, Iceland, USA, Australia and New Zealand. PB4L is not about changing students, it is about changing the environment, systems and practices to support children to make positive behaviour choices.

It is about:

- establishing a school environment that supports long term success
- integrating positive academic and social behaviour expectations
- teaching desirable behaviours
- improving behaviour support systems for students
- increasing positive interactions with students
- using data for decision making
- decreasing reactive management
- maximising academic achievement.



WHAT IS HOLIDAY PROGRAMME?

WHAT HAPPENS?


Junior Triathlon
