From The Principal - Te Pū kāea a te Tumuaki

Kia ora koutou, School years go by in a blur at the best of times but it's hard to fully grasp how quickly the end of the year has rolled around. There are only 13 and a half schools days left before we finish for the year - can you believe it?

Nothing is slowing down though - each day is still full of learning activities here at school. At this time of the year we are so grateful that we are one of the few schools in Christchurch that has its own swimming pool - it is certainly being well used.

Thank you to those who joined us at our assembly this morning as we celebrated multiple examples of success. This week we have also had some of our staff celebrating their success in completing the Te Ahu o Te Reo Māori course they have been studying for this semester. Congratulations to Helen Parata and Emma Burgess on completing Level 4, Emma Lynn Level 2, and Talei Cordes, Lisa Handley, Courtney Ruske and Lauren McDonnell Level 1. This study requires a significant amount of teachers out of school time, and for Helen, Emma B and Emma L this is the second course they have completed this year. We are extremely fortunate to have staff here who are focussed on upskilling their own levels of te reo Māori, so that we as a school can play our part in ensuring that Māori language is valued and sustained as a living language in Aotearoa.

Thank you for your support

We would like to thank you all very much for your support yesterday in collecting your children at lunch time so that the teachers could attend their union meeting at Redwood School. These meetings are currently happening across the city as teachers prepare to engage with the Ministry of Education about their pay and working conditions. While I absolutely agree that everybody could do with a little more in their pay packet, I think that what teachers really need is a reduction in the amount of administration that the system currently requires to do. The demands of compliance have pushed so many New Zealand teachers into a role where all they do is put material in front of students and then assess that material when the child is done with it. Over the past ten years the system has forced teachers to treat administration as their core business.

This is not what we want the teachers who choose to work at Rāwhiti to be doing. We don't want our learning studios to be assembly-line factories like some other schools - places where students turn up in the morning, are housed for the day and have worksheets placed in front of them. We want our teachers to be creating extraordinary learning experiences for our children. Experiences that involve opening doorways so that children can enter a world of passion and excitement that engages them, and ensures they take responsibility for their own learning beyond the end of the school day. These things together are necessary to ensure that children are prepared to meet the demands of life in the 21st century.



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

Our vision is to provide fun, memory making experiences for young people in their school holidays. Our youthwork staff are supported by groups of volunteers to create an environment that encourages friendships and new experiences around positive role-models. We have Te Kahui Kahu Social Service Accreditation, which includes extensive policies, procedures and police vetting of staff.

WHAT HAPPENS?

Doors open at 8:30am (not before) and everyone must be signed-in on our digital screens. You can arrive anytime between 8:30am - 9:00am which is our free-play time. At 9:00am each programme gathers together to begin their day. Pick-up is between 4:00pm - 4:30pm, which is also free-time.

Each day a leader shares a 5 minute Christian thought for the day. Often based on a Bible story, nobody is forced to do anything, and all beliefs and opinions are valued. Updates and photos are shared on our Youth Alive Trust Facebook page.

COST
