From The Principal continued ...

Last week I took a couple of days out to join a group of our Year 7 & 8 students on their overnight tramp to Lake Daniell. This was part of the William Pike Challenge that our seniors can get involved in, and a great opportunity for these young people to put themselves outside of their comfort zone - no wifi and composting toilets - and see a part of New Zealand that will be unfamiliar to many.

Thank you to our amazing PTA for their initiative in arranging parent helpers for the Year 4-8 athletics sports this week. After the restrictions of the past three 'covid years' it is wonderful to have parents back in school supporting both students and teachers.

That said, we are watching nervously to see what is happening with the latest surge in Covid cases linked to the new BQ11 variant. This is now our reality as new variants emerge, and means the school may be required to quickly implement measures to cope—measures we are used to from previous experience. In the meantime these are the measures we need your help with:

- keep sick children at home. They may return 48 hours after no symptoms
- if your child tests positive with COVID please inform us and keep them isolated for 7 days.

Sadly, we experienced some mindless vandalism at school over the long weekend with two of our largest shade sails being slashed beyond repair, and the slack line outside Tāwhirimatea being cut. Fortunately, we have security cameras covering most of our grounds and we have been able to identify those responsible and report their behaviour to the police. Any member of the community wilfully damaging school property outside of school hours will be formally trespassed from our grounds. We have invested so much in creating a beautiful environment for our whole community to enjoy and can not let thoughtless actions go unaddressed.
