IMPORTANT Parking Messages



There are TWO allocated mobility car parks **(YELLOW LINES)** directly outside the main pedestrian access to our school. These are designated for members of our community who hold **MOBILITY PARKING PERMITS ONLY.**

We need our whole **COMMUNITY** to park with integrity to ensure that these parks are left free **at all times** for our whānau who have registered Mobility Parking Permits.

This is essential to get their children safely dropped off and picked up. Help us make this school a place that is inclusive and safe for all.



3 Minute Parking

The angle car parks directly outside the school gates are designated as **3 minute parks.** These parks are supposed to be for drop-off only, to improve the flow of traffic in Leaver Terrace. If you are going to be more than 3 minutes then you need to park somewhere else. Some parents are using these parks for upwards of 30 minutes at the beginning and end of each day.



Broken Yellow Lines

The area opposite Grantly Street marked with **YELLOW** lines is supposed to be **NO STOPPING.** However, we regularly see parents using this area for both parallel and angle parking. This action creates a hazard for those cars turning in and out of Grantly Street.

We will not hesitate to send a photo with the licence plate to both our Community Police Officer and the Council where infringements notices may be issued if cars are parked ILLEGALLY.

Our ultimate goal is that Rāwhiti is a kura that shows manaakitanga to one another and follows all road rules/guidelines to keep our PRECIOUS ākonga safe.

COVID

While it is not making the national news everyday, Covid is still active in our community. We currently have Covid cases **in each of our Learning Studios and amongst our staff**. Please inform us if your child has COVID. If your child has COVID they must stay home from school for 7 days. If a member of the family has COVID the household contacts do not need to isolate but should test daily for 5 days.

In Zone and Out of Zone (OOZ) Enrolments

Now that we have the Aotahi learning space up and running, the Board of Trustees is once again accepting applications for enrolment from children living outside of our school zone who have a sibling currently enrolled at Rāwhiti School. Applications to enrol an OOZ sibling must go into the ballot along with all other OOZ applications, but siblings do have a higher priority than everyone else, except applications for the bilingual programme. You can see the ballot dates on our website under the enrolment information, or you can contact Kim in the office and she will assist you with the dates and appropriate forms.

If you live **in** our school zone and have a five year old due to start school this year please take a moment to complete an enrolment form and hand it in to Kim in the office so that we can plan effectively for your child's transition to school. It is never too early to enrol!

With people travelling overseas again, there's a risk that someone with measles could unknowingly bring the disease back to Aotearoa. Measles spreads easily and quickly, usually between people who are unimmunised or only partially immunised. It can be serious and life threatening. In the 2019 measles outbreak in Aotearoa more than 30% of the people infected had to be admitted to hospital. The best protection against measles is the free MMR vaccine. It will protect you and your whānau, and prevent the virus from spreading. You will be protected against measles if you: have had 2 doses of the MMR vaccine were born before 1 Jan 1969. |

Cost: \$55—this includes all the equipment, glue and the kit—you just bring along your fabric of choice, and your lunch.


