From the Rāwhiti School Board

I feel extremely privileged to have been re-elected as the Presiding Member (formerly known as the Chairperson) for the Rāwhiti School Board. I have been on the Board since 2018. I sit alongside the other elected parent representatives – Tim Scott, Jess Poff, Jody Hohaia O'Sullivan, and Briar Thompson. Helen Hogarth is the current staff representative.

The Board has co-opted Thomas Parata to support us through the process of the new build for our bilingual programme. Thomas had previously been an elected parent rep on the board for five years, sits on the boards of two other schools, and leads the bilingual teaching programme at Te Oraka Shirley Intermediate.

Our board has three strategic goals that guide our planning and decision making for the school:

- The RISE values and dispositions are the focus of our curriculum
- Enhanced hauora for our staff
- Strong partnerships with our community.

We will know we have been successful when:

- Our learners are engaged and supported in learning that is relevant, challenging, and accessible to all.
- Our staff are well equipped to respond positively to workplace challenges and opportunities in ways that maintain and promote wellbeing.
- Our community contributes to, understands, and supports the learning and culture of Rāwhiti School.

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From the Rāwhiti School Board continued ...

One of our responsibilities as a board is to monitor the levels of achievement. At the end of each year, we analyse student achievement in Reading, Writing and Maths across the school to look for trends. After three consecutive years of disruption due to Covid, we were interested to see if that had had any impact on levels of achievement across the schools, as had been predicted by many. We are very pleased to report that our 2022 data shows increased levels of achievement in Maths, and stable levels of achievement in Reading and Writing.

- **Reading**: 85% of children achieving At or Above the expected curriculum levels (84 % at the end of 2021)
- **Writing**: 75.4% of children achieving At or Above the expected curriculum levels (same as 2021)
- **Maths**: 86% of children achieving At or Above the expected curriculum levels (79% at the end of 2021).

It is an exciting time for the Board with a national curriculum refresh just around the corner and the bilingual build on the horizon.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank Liz, Paul, Helen P and the entire Rāwhiti staff for their dedication and commitment to our school, without these amazing people we would not have achieved the results we have to date. We are also extremely fortunate to have knowledgeable and dedicated people who sit at our board table and freely give a great deal of their time to ensure Rāwhiti School continues to achieve and thrive.
