Kia ora koutou, Heading in to the last three weeks of school it is hard to tell if we are 'winding down' or 'winding up'!

Our Year 7s and 8s have just finished their three day camps down at Staveley. I had a fantastic day down there last week taking part in the 'legacy project' work in the beech forest, where our Year 7s were learning to identify native species and also helping remove exotic plants. I loved seeing how hard our students worked and hearing how well they understood the need for this important work. It was delightful to receive the following message from the camp staff today:

On Tuesday evening I joined dozens of proud Rāwhiti parents and whanau at the Town Hall for this years Children's University graduation. Of all the schools represented on the night, Rāwhiti had by far the largest number of graduates, who had amassed a staggering number of learning hours outside of school across the year. Of particular significance, this year Heath (from Ata Hapara) received our first ever **Gold Fellowship Award** for completing 1000 hours of extra learning. I need to extend special thanks to Helen Parata, our in-school coordinator, who goes above and beyond to ensure that everyone meets their targets.

Staffing Changes

The Board of Trustees has regretfully accepted resignations from three of our staff members.

Nicole Cunningham has been on leave in 2023 and has now accepted a leadership role at Ao Tawhiti. Nicole is one of our Rāwhiti School foundation staff members. We will miss Nicole's passion for working with early learners, her enthusiasm, her energy, and her sense of fun.

Nogo Sipeli is retiring from teaching at the end of this year. Nogo joined the Rāwhiti teaching team in 2017 as the Team Leader in the Year 7-8 area of the school. He stepped down from this role earlier this year in preparation for his upcoming retirement. Nogo has been a calming presence in the senior school and has made significant contributions at a number of schools during his teaching career.

Maggie Nicholson is completing her first year as a teacher in Rongo-mā-tāne and has won a position at West Melton School for 2024.

Sophie Bruinsma and Stacey Hewson are also coming to the end of their fixed term contacts with us. Sophie will be returning home to Perth after a year teaching in Rongo-mā-tāne and we know that Sophie will not miss the winter temperatures of Christchurch (and some of the summer ones either!). Stacey started with us as the third teacher in our New Entrant studio, Aotahi, at the beginning of term 2 and successfully transitioned a cohort of Year 1 children through to Rongo-mā-tāne at the beginning of Term 3. We are very grateful to both of these talented teachers for all they have done for our learners across the year, and we wish them all the very best as they move on to the next stage of their careers.


