New Entrants

If you live in the Rāwhiti School zone and have a child who will be starting school in 2026 then now is the time to enrol. If you know that there are changes ahead for you in 2026 and that you will no longer be part of the Rāwhiti whanau, please inform the school office sooner, rather than later.
