On Tuesday this week, we celebrated the culmination of the Te Mātāpuna Mātātahi Children's University Programme for the year, with 42 of our students graduating at the Christchurch Town Hall. The awards ranged from the Bronze Award for 30 hours right through to the top award, the Gold Fellowship, presented for 1,000 hours. Students gain hours for participating in exciting, engaging learning experiences outside the classroom. A huge effort was put in by all our students and whānau, and our congratulations go to all of our graduates.


On a more serious note ... our shared pathways.

Yesterday after school one of our littlest learners got knocked down and then run over by a cyclist biking out of the school grounds. It was an accident and the rider did check on the injured person but this could have been avoided.

Please note the rules around cyclists at school. <u>All</u> cyclists need to use the **bike entrance** coming to and leaving from school. Riders need to dismount from their bike at the small gate then walk their bike to the bike racks. At the end of the day all cyclists need to walk their bikes from the bike rack to the small gate. If they need to go somewhere around the school with their bike, they must walk their bike to where they are going. There should be no wheels ridden past the swale in front of the studios during school hours 8:30 am - 3:30 pm - all wheels should either be walked (bikes, scooters) or carried (skateboards, skates).

Rāwhiti School has 5 gates into the school from Leaver Terrace.

The 4 pedestrian pathways are shared.

Junior Athletics

Last Thursday Christi came to our classroom to teach yr 5/6 how to weave plaits with Harakeke. She gave us a demonstration of how to weave and she passed around some examples of what we can make with harakeke like baskets, different types of plaits and our teacher Lou showed us a kete she made out of chip packets. Then Christi showed us her special shell which he uses to get the muka out of the harakeke which is the fine white stuff in the middle. That the experienced students would use to plait later on. Christi asked us some questions and we had a discussion about harakeke and safety about washing our hands afterwards. After that the experienced weavers were given fine harakeke and the beginners were given normal harakeke then we started weaving.

The reason Christie visited is because we were reading a story for our literacy called Matakite and the Mokai. The story was about a blind girl telling a slaved hard working boy about how he could be a Mokai. The girl sees visions while she weaves and gives him the rope she weaved and later on he uses it to save his chief's son. This action earns respect from him.

Weaving was a challenge but it turned out to be neat. This was a great experience and I'm very grateful that we could have someone in our community who could do this with us thank you Christi! By Millicent and Paloma.


